- Thursday 11th January.


We have also announced our Nursery Open Morning dates:



Curriculum Corner

Maths mastery for all!

Number lines

When learning mathematics at Swing Gate School, the children develop a conceptual understanding through the Concrete, Pictorial and Abstract (CPA) approach where children handle physical resources, use pictorial representations and record using traditional abstract numbers and symbols. To help you understand this approach, we will explore some of the key pieces of equipment and representations that we use at school. This week, we are looking at number lines.

Number Lines



Number lines can be used from the Foundation Stage, where children learn to recognise and order numbers. They may be given a blank number line and be asked to put numbers on it.

In Key Stage One, number lines can be used to calculate. For example a child might be asked to solve $7 + 2 = ?$, where they would mark 7 on the number line and then count on two until they get to 9.

Number lines can also be used to solve multiplication and division questions by jumping along the number line in repeated steps. To solve $5 \times 4 = ?$, a child could jump along a number line in 4s five times until they reach the number 20.



At home, number lines can be drawn on the ground using chalk or on paper. You can also search for different types of number lines, for example when looking at house numbers on the road or at the divisions on measuring tapes and weighing scales. Playing board games like snakes and ladders is also a good, early introduction to the concept of moving forwards and backwards on a number line.

Healthy Eating

Snowflake Pretzels

Ingredients

- 200g white chocolate chips for cooking plus 50g extra to make lollies
- 32 mini pretzels (about 45g)
- white or silver sprinkles
- 8 paper lolly sticks (optional)



Method

- 1)** Put a sheet of baking parchment or a non-stick baking tray. Melt the chocolate carefully in a microwave or in a bowl set over a pan of simmering water. Turn off the heat but leave the bowl on the pan. Add the pretzels and stir well.
- 2)** Lift the pretzels out of the chocolate with a fork, shaking them so the excess chocolate drips off, put them on the tray and freeze for 5 mins to set. Dip the pretzels in the chocolate again, then lay four at a time on the tray and push them together, with the pointy ends in the centre, to make a snowflake shape. Add a blob more chocolate in the middle of each. Before they set, decorate with the sprinkles. Leave somewhere cold to set.
- 3)** If you want to make the pretzel snowflakes into lollipops, melt the extra 50g chocolate as before and make eight well-spaced blobs, the size of a 1p coin, on some non-stick liner. Put a paper lolly stick

on each blob so one end is in the chocolate, then press a pretzel snowflake gently on top and leave to set.
